Dear Parents & Carers.

What a lovely sunny start to this week! It has been so lovely to see the children enjoying the sunshine over the last couple of days. All the children have once again returned to school with big smiles and excitement about their new topics.

This term is a busy one at Cathedral Primary. Next week is Book Week. We will be celebrating World Book Day on Thursday 7th March. This is a day we all look forward to when staff and children dress up as book characters. The staff have been very busy discussing costume ideas! We also look forward to welcoming the visiting author Andy Seed who will be leading a whole school assembly and class workshops on the Friday. This term we will also have a Science Week. Please keep an eye on your child's class pages to check out the activities taking place.

At the end of the term we are going to be participating in Maths Week. All classes will be engaging in lots of mathematical activities outside of their daily Maths lessons, including attending KS1 and KS2 Maths Assemblies led by our Subject Leaders Danuta Perryer and David Byron. There will be a whole school maths challenge where every child will participate in building a large mathematical structure! This will be on display in the school, along with all the other mathematical masterpieces on Thursday 4th April. We will invite you to join us for a celebration of our learning and to participate in some live maths events run by staff and students.

There was much excitement again this year in Reception as the children carefully cared for eggs in an incubator. The eggs successfully hatched and provided many opportunities for the children to learn about how we care for chicks. I regularly saw the children busy taking notes and recording pictures to record progress. Again, the viewing area for the chicks was visited by lots of children from throughout the school. A huge thank you once again to the PTA for supporting us with this very special project.

We were all very proud of Year 2 at the end of last term when they wowed us with their Class Assembly. It was wonderful to hear about the missions they were sent throughout their topic 'Infinity and Beyond'. I was

particularly impressed with their knowledge of the solar system and their creative report writing about the mysterious object that arrived at school!

The Green Team have been busy planning their tasks for this term. We have a very committed group of children led by Miss Tennant. They will soon be presenting their initiatives plan. The Green Team have already organised to borrow some litter pick equipment from Bristol Waste to support the National litter pick week. Look out for our teams of volunteers supporting this initiative.

It has been reported recently that there is an increase in the number of cars entering and exiting during the start and end of the day. Many cars are parking illegally. 

### Internet Safety

Although we haven't had any reports from children or parents at Cathedral Primary School, we want to bring your attention to a possible concern that other parents and schools have faced recently. We have become aware of highly inappropriate videos circulating online which are being viewed by children. These video clips are appearing on many social media sites and YouTube (including Kids YouTube). One of the videos starts innocently, like the start of a Peppa Pig episode for example, but quickly turn into an altered version with violence and offensive language. Another video clip, which is believed to have originated last summer, is going by the name of 'MoMo' which shows a warped white mask promoting children to do dangerous tasks without telling their parents. Examples have included asking the children to turn the gas on or to find and take tablets.

Online challenges like Momo may cause concern however these 'challenges' appear every few months and there have been other examples over time.

As you can imagine, this would be highly distressing for children to view. Please do not panic but speak with your children about all aspects of their online world & explain potential dangers. We encourage you to be vigilant when your child is using any device or watching any clips. We would also encourage all parents/carers to remind the children of online rules:

If any child sees anything upsetting or concerning, they must tell an adult immediately, pausing or locking the screen first so as not to view it further.

Please do not hesitate to talk to your child's class teacher if you have any worries.

#### Shine After School Club
