As we now move into the final term, we are looking forward to some exciting events. Mr. Baynton has been working really hard with your children to develop their athletic and teamwork skills ready for sports day. The PTA are busy preparing for the annual summer fair at Failand, always so well attended by our families. Year 6 are working really hard prepping dance routines, learning songs and acting out scenes for the musical 'Matilda'. This musical is the story of an extraordinary little girl who, armed with a vivid imagination and a sharp mind, dares to take a stand and change her own destiny. The children are really enjoying working towards this performance.

Once again, there have been so many curriculum highlights for this term. These are just a snapshot of some that the teachers would like to share:

★ **Reception** - This Term, we dived Under the Sea to explore all things Aquatic! We have learned about different habitats, made an Under the Sea fact book, channelled our inner pirate and even made our very own Aquarium dioramas.

★ Year 1 - This term Year 1 have been really busy doing lots of musical collaborations! Our trip to Bristol Grammar School for a Key Stage Summer Sing Workshop was a huge success and the children got to show off their creative skills, joining in with a range of music. A few of our children were selected to take part in the Ocean Adventure musical enrichment day with Year 1 students from other schools. And to finish it all off, they were busking to raise money on the last Wednesday of term, showing off their growing passion for looking after our planet!



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 \neq Year 2 - We have been learning about what plants need to survive and thrive. We have even conducted an experiment to discover what beans need to germinate!

★ Year 3 - We have done amazingly well with their MEGA Mondays so far this term. Their Ukulele lessons have been so much fun and all the children have shown resilience and perseverance. Learning the fiddly fingering for these stringed instruments is not always easy! Swimming has been action-packed too! The children have loved practising their skills in the water and developing their confidence.

★ Year 4 - We have been learning about electricity. We had a go at making our own circuits with lightbulbs and buzzers.

Year 5 - Year 5 has been waiting for this term for the opportunity to go to Forest School. We have been learning how to tie knots and created our own Mayan inspired eye, using weaving and knots.

Year 6 - Year 6 worked incredibly hard in the lead up to and during SATs week this term, we finished the week with a lovely trip to Brandon Hill to celebrate!

Values and Focus

This term throughout collective worship we have focused on **Friendship**. The children have thought about what Friendship means to us and what skills make up a good friend. Our poem this term helps us to think about what friendship is:

The children have been showing friendship throughout their learning this term, with a clear link to our Jigsaw learning. EYFS have been finding out ways to solve problems in friendships when they arise. We talked about how we can use our words to negotiate to find a solution. Year 1 have been focussing on their friendship with the planet, thinking selflessly about what they can do to help save our planet! Year 2's and 3's have focussed on relationships in their PSHE learning, using different systems to help repair friendships and learning different strategies to solve conflicts. Upper KS2 have been applying their skills to work collaboratively at Forest School and by celebrating their friends during weekly raffles!



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Collective Voices have continued to inspire the children with their support in Collective Worship. They have also joined the Canon Missionaire to deliver worship on Thursday mornings with KS2. The team have helped to run 'friendship bracelet' workshops for different children across the year groups. They have celebrated those who showed the many attributes of a good friend! Next term, the team will be recruiting a new group of collective voices from Year 5, who will be taking over their duties when they move on to secondary school! They are looking forward to training up our Collective Voices apprentices!

Next term our assemblies will be focused on our school value Respect.
