Dear Parents and Carers,

I have just returned from our first whole school Achievement Assembly at the Cresswell Theatre. It is so wonderful to have opportunities for the whole school to be together. There have been so many achievements this term! It is really wonderful for children to share their particular strengths. Already our Reception children are singing and sharing their learning with such confidence. We were particularly proud of our Year 3 class who took us all back in time for their Roman Assembly.

We continue to forge links with Bristol Cathedral and in particular with The Education Department. Year 3 took part in the 'Big Draw' and were very inspired by the Cathedral. The children enjoyed designing their own stain glass windows and mosaic. It was lovely to hear back how exemplary their behaviour was on this visit.

As we move into the second half of this term we will be inviting you in for some curriculum evenings. Reception parents will be invited to a 'Reading Event'. This will be an opportunity for parents to learn about our reading approach at Cathedral Primary School and how you can support at home. We are also anticipating a feature performance from the incredible BCCS Gospel Choir! We look forward to seeing you at some of these events.

Miss Bailey has been making links with our Year 3 children and developing their responsibility skills. Year 3 children took part in trial mentor sessions where they supported the Reception children in their reading, learning and playtimes. Ten children have been selected to be a mentor for ten weeks. The children are very excited about this opportunity and will be wearing a Mentor Badge. Please do look out for these children and congratulate them on this important role. There will be opportunities later on in the year for other children to apply for these posts.

Thank you all for your support this term with settling your children into new classes and routine. We look forward to sharing lots more success with you next term.
