A big thank you to all parents and children for making the Children in Need day so much fun. The children all looked wonderful and the staff impressed us with their colourful outfits. Through your generous contributions we managed to raise over £700! We look forward now to our Christmas Jumper Day that will be coming up soon.

It was lovely that so many parents joined us for the virtual Parents Evening. We are very proud of the children and the progress they have made so far this term. This year we have again taken part in Anti Bullying Week. Miss Bailey led a class assembly which focused on how to be united against bullying. The children and staff also all took part in Odd Socks Day. Odd Socks Day supports us with encouraging acceptance of individuality at an early age and can help prevent bullying later in life. Once again children and staff had some very colourful combinations of socks.

I am delighted to report that the Department for Education has approved that Cathedral Primary School is to adopt a Faith Designation and become a Church of England School. This will come into effect from 1st December 2020. As part of this change we are working with the school community to review Cathedral Primary School's Vision and Values. Thank you for all your support throughout the consultation process. As you probably know we now have a new Dean of Bristol, the Very Revd Dr Mandy Ford. The Dean is looking forward to working with Cathedral Primary School and will be meeting the children through an assembly later this term.



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This term has seen some exciting experiences in school to really immerse the children in their topic learning and to provide great stimulus for writing opportunities. We've had a Stone Age workshop in Year 3, a visit from a Viking in Year 4 and we've seen the night sky through the Explorodome in Year 1. Children also learnt about Remembrance Sunday in all year groups, with Year 6 studying the poems of Wilfrid Owen, building up to them writing their own very emotive poems.
