What a wonderful term! There have been so many end of term Christmas celebrations and each one of them has blown us away. The singing around the school and during the performances has made Cathedral Primary School feel exceptionally festive this year!

The Reception children's singing blew us away in their performances of "A little Bird told me". Such courage after only being in school for two terms! Year 1 performed 'The Night Before Christmas' with the most amazing singing and acting. Year 2 wowed everyone with their brilliant singing and dancing in their Christmas Show! We are incredibly proud of them.

I am sure that those of you who came to the Key Stage Two Carol Service in the Cathedral will agree that it was a very special evening hearing the Christmas Story and the singing from our children this year. We thought they were amazing!

Since writing the last newsletter there have once again been some really exciting learning and events. The CPS Rock Stars had their first Rock Band recital. Children in Need raised £341 and Odd Socks day raised £248. Thank you so much for supporting these important charities . We also held our Remembrance service in the Cathedral. Our Chamber Choir participated in Bristol Beacon's Choir evening at St. Georges which was a fantastic event that we were very proud to be part of.

Reception have had an extremely immersive second term in school. They have been looking at how different cultures and religions celebrate, including making Diva lamps and Rangoli patterns when they were learning about Diwali. We also explored the story of the Nativity, culminating in two phenomenal performances in front of our Mummies, Daddies and Carers. We are looking forward to what Term 3 will bring...

Year 1 have had such a busy term and are bursting with knowledge in all of their learning. They are especially proud of their Science books and the incredible work they have completed around Animals including Humans. They can tell you all the animal types and what they eat! What super scientists they are.

Year 2 had the chance to perform songs with children from other schools on their trip to the Spiegeltent. Another highlight of the term was sharing some of their wonderful writing with Year 1 in a special storytime. They also had very special visitors from the Fire Service.

Year 3 have written brilliant historical stories this term based on the book Stone Age Boy. They enjoyed learning about the human body in Science and finding out more about the UK in Geography. They've also had great fun getting Christmassy with lots of carol singing and making decorations and cards.

Year 4 have really enjoyed learning about States of Matter in Science and investigating how materials change state. They have written fantastic diary entries using their historical knowledge of the Anglo-Saxons and analysed different sources in History. In our textiles unit, they designed their own pouches and learnt how to sew on a button and do the running stitch. They showed excellent resilience and the results were amazing! Year 5 have immersed themselves in their writing this term. We were particularly impressed with their Greek myth narratives showing endless creativity. That's not the only value that they've shown, in Maths it's been amazing to see their courage and resilience with formal multiplication and division methods. Year 6 have enjoyed learning about WW2 and exploring the impact of the war in Bristol and beyond! They have created amazing artwork by looking at cubism. In English, they have made some beautiful and informative explanatory texts all about light, which they have explored through science! Huge thanks once again to the PTA for organising Christmas fundraising events. The Christmas Fair was a real success this year and it was so lovely to see so many of you there! That and the annual Christmas tree selling and wreath making have all been fantastic fund raisers for the school. Of course the children loved receiving books from Santa too! The children loved getting presents from Santa. Once again the children had some good questions prepared for Santa - Is Rudolph the cutest reindeer? How much magic does it take to get across the world? Does Father Christmas have a Lamborghini? Christmas has felt very magical on the last day of term.
